Kids' Trip—1999

July 12, 1999 will be the 50th Annual Kids' Trip. I feel honored to be the Chairman for this event. This year the trip will be run out of the Los Angeles Harbor area. Appropriately enough we are "going for the gold" for number 50. It is our ambition to host five hundred kids and counselors for this trip. I say it is our ambition because at this writing this is a vision and only a lot of hard work and some luck will make it a reality. The Kids' Trip is a major undertaking under any circumstances. This upcoming trip will be the most ambitious and most complex ever attempted by the LARRC and the LARRC Foundation.

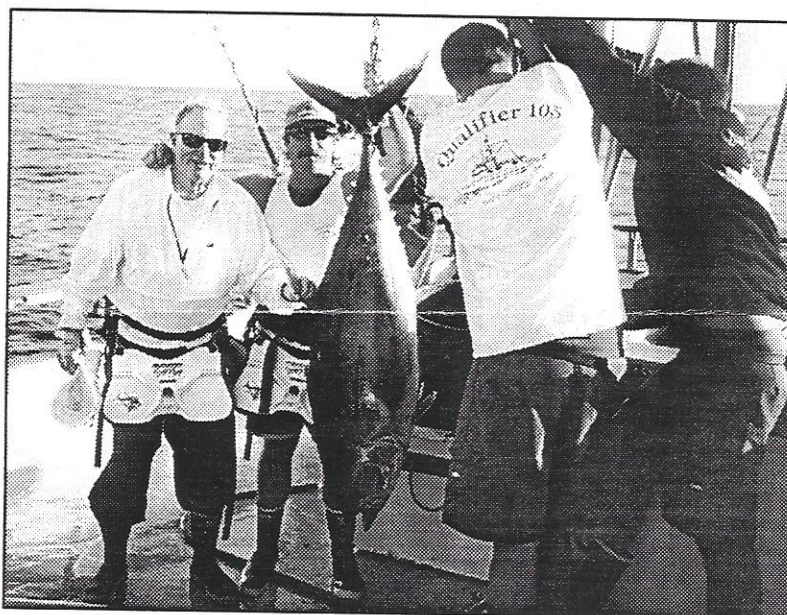
The first step toward making this vision a reality is to enlist the participation of each and every member of the Club. Everyone, yes everyone, can play a part in making this happen. Obviously it would be ideal to have every Club member present on the day of this trip. Obviously this is not realistic for many reasons. However, there are myriad tasks to be carried out during the next seven months leading up to the trip. It is during this period that everyone, each and every member, has the opportunity to participate in some way.

I have formed a Transportation Committee which will provide transport of equipment, supplies and goods prior to and on the day of the Kids' Trip 50. We will need volunteers who have trucks, vans, or SUVs who can run errands during the preparation period to pick up items and deliver them to other mem-

KIDS' TRIP

Qualifier 105—San Diego to Cabo

Friday, November 27, and stuffed with Thanksgiving turkey, LARRC members **Jay Lash, Ben Susman, Julian Wolf, Barry Taper** and myself joined 15 other anglers on an 8-day ride down to Cabo—fly back aboard the *Qualifier 105*. The boat, under the able leadership of Captain Jack Webster, cleared the point mid-afternoon and headed south. Unfortunately the weather was crap, and the fishing reports down the line were "el stinko." The next day just after lunch we fished an area known as Canoa where everybody loaded up on school-size yellowtail (8 to 12 lbs.). That night the *Qualifier 105* headed further south. Weather was still rotten and fishing reports from the ridge and Alijos Rocks were not good. The next day more yellowtail were caught off San Pablo.

Enough smaller-size yellowtail were caught at San Pablo, so Jack headed to Alijos. Only 7 yellowfin were caught but they were quality fish. Jay landed a 114-lb. fish on the kite, which turned out to be the jackpot for the trip. **Brad Felger** was right behind in second place with a 113-pounder. Also, a few better grade yellowtail were landed. The same day we were at Alijos the *Polaris Supreme* nailed 55 wahoo outside Magdalena Bay. The next morning the *Qualifier 105* and the *Polaris Supreme* drew blanks in the same area that was so productive the day before. Back to the Rocks, where we stayed put for the next several days (joined by the *Polaris Supreme*). Fishing was slow, and you really needed to be persistent. If you had a line in the water

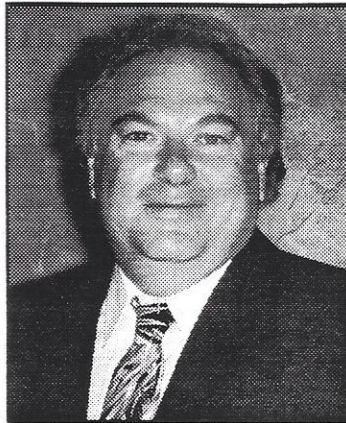
EDITORIAL By Dan Felger

In 1980, Michael moved to Los Angeles to work in senior management with Columbia Pictures Television, and then Coca Cola Telecommunications. Several years ago, Michael left the motion picture and television business to pursue full time his true passion: fishing. He now manufactures inshore graphite fishing rods under the name of Executive Action, repairs reels and works part time at a fishing tackle store. The rest of the time is devoted to on the water "research, development and field testing." He is also a licensed commercial pilot and licensed amateur radio operator (K2JWM).

Michael has two grown sons: Adam, a director and writer who lives in Santa Monica; and Jonathan, a musician and song writer whose band just completed a European tour. Michael lives in Tarzana with his wife, Paula Schoen, a physician who has a medical practice in Los Angeles.

1. Departure time will be 5:00 am, from Sea Landing, Santa Barbara. However, some trips may depart earlier. These earlier departures will be at the sole discretion of the Charter Master after consultation with the Skipper.
2. The trips will be planned for local surface calico bass; however, opportunities to fish for exotics, such as white sea bass and yellowtail or salmon, will take precedent. Also, several trips will be for light tackle rockfish and/or halibut at Santa Rosa or San Miguel. Other trips may be to Point Conception.
3. Return time will usually be 4:00 - 4:30pm, but could be earlier or later depending on fishing conditions and weather, and will be determined by the Skipper.
4. Bunks will be on a first come basis and cannot be reserved. However, the Charter Master may reserve two, large forward bunks for those participants who because of age or physical limitations require special consideration. If you think you qualify please let the Charter Master know.
5. Loads will be limited to 17 adults or 18 people if juniors are participating. The Charter Master reserves the right to overbook by one.

7. Charter price includes trip, bait, soft drinks, beer, icing fish, BREAKFAST AND LUNCH. Not included are tips and fish cleaning. (Please be generous with the tips for the crew.)

when the tuna came by, you had a good chance of hooking up.

Some of the highlights were Jay Lash getting nailed to the rail when a tuna hit his kite bait; an angler landing an 76-lb. yellowtail that took a 3-lb. scad mackerel (This fish will be officially weighed for a possible world record); and one angler who landed 11 of the 44 better-grade tuna using chunk bait. The boat arrived in Cabo Saturday, December 5, and most of us flew home that day. The weather was cold and the seas rough for almost the entire trip. The swells at Alijos were 15 feet, or higher. Also, the water temperature everywhere was 5 to 7 degrees cooler than normal. Jack Webster made all the correct moves to make the trip successful and, as usual, the crew of the *Qualifier 105* was wonderful.

Tackle Tips of the Month

 A common problem with rods is the tip coming loose or rotating out of position. Often this can be fixed by simply heating the tip guide with a lighter which will melt the glue inside. Reset the tip and allow to cool. If this does not work, the guide probably will need to be reglued. A stick of hot melt glue is available at all tackle shops.

 When traveling on an airplane, rods should be put into a rod caddy, wrapped in an old sheet or in rod socks. The rod caddy should have spots for locks, however they are not of much use. To insure the safety and security of your rods use duct tape and lots of it to secure the caddy.

 Long Rangers! Use kitty litter in your hook box to absorb moisture. This prevents hooks from rusting.

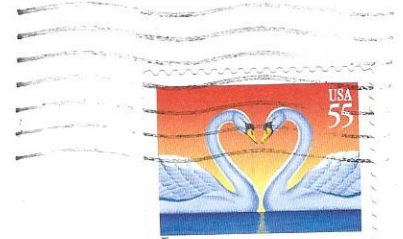
