

ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

◆ THE IMPORTANCE OF ANGLING!!!

In case you had not heard this before — California Sportfishing brings in \$4.6 Billion according to a release by the American Sportfishing Association. This is the total impact that almost three million anglers have on our economy. Boat building, housing, travel, hotels etc. all benefit from this activity. No doubt such numbers would interest our politicians and make them more receptive to the needs required to keep this activity flourishing. Anglers supporting their favorite organization can certainly help.

◆ GET READY NOW!!!

The March issue of Salt Water Sportsman refers to the west-coast complex water conditions. After some unusual warm water specimens showing up last season in normally cooler waters it is now predicted that more stable temperatures can be expected. What could this mean? After seeing that 2016 was the hottest year – after 2015 and 2014 – cooler water temperatures may see an unusual albacore run.

◆ DID YOU KNOW???

A six month long investigation by the Associated Press revealed a number of serious labor abuses aboard commercial fishing vessels in southeast Asia. Indonesian, Thai and Cambodian nationals conscripted to work on boats found themselves in conditions close to slavery. Long hours, minimal living conditions, questionable food and health issues were being looked into by the Hawaii Longline Association. Also involved were the fishing vessel owners and the Hawaii Seafood Council. It appears there is a legal loophole that allows the fleet to hire cheap labor as long as they don't set foot on U.S. soil. Whole Foods, for one, has decided to drop the Hawaii Fish Auction as a source until these unfair labor practices are resolved. US Federal officials have noted they do not have the resources to check labor contracts.

NOAA last year announced plans for better tracking of imported seafood from overseas sources. It should be noted that 90% of all seafood consumed in the US is imported.



◆ RETURN TO YOUR DINNER PLATES...

In other news from Salt Water Sportsman we learn that canary rockfish, declared off limits for a decade may now be kept after having been declared overfished in 2000. Effective March 1st, a new bag limit of 10 rockfish could include one canary. It was reported that conservation efforts led to a healthier stock sooner than had been anticipated.

♦ NEWS FROM ON HIGH...

The January Chumline advised you that John Ballotti had been appointed to the Marine Protected Areas Federal Advisory Committee. You should now know that they list 13 underwater parks encompassing more than 600,000 square miles of Ocean and Great Lakes. This committee works as part of NOAA and John advises that he has now been invited to participate in a May meeting to plot a five year strategy for the National Marine Sanctuary System. Their goal is to ensure thriving sanctuaries, safeguard these marine treasures, increase support for the sanctuaries, enhance our understanding of them and encourage their development. John, we wish you a pleasant trip and look forward to hearing more about it. In case you readers are wondering how this affects you — the Channel Islands, Monterey Bay, the Farallones and Cordell Bank as well as the Olympic Coast are west coast sanctuaries.



Beautiful Friday morning – no clouds in the sky – a good day to go fishing.

Volunteers arrived at 7:30am with the anticipation of the arrival of the students at 9:00am. Setting up tackle, cutting bait, prepping food for breakfast and lunch, and setting up the fish cleaning station. This year we had 97 volunteers from Los Angeles Rod & Reel Club, California Fish and Wildlife, Long Beach State University, the Berke family, Friends of Castaic, US Forest Service with Smokey the Bear and 4 members of the service, Fishing News Network, Blood Soldiers Mens Group, friends and family of club members. There were 80 students this year from MacClay Middle School, Lassen Middle School, and Lokrantz Special Education Center with teachers, principals and family.



This year with the assistance of Emilio Rebollar/Fish and Wildlife, I,600 pounds of catfish were put in the lake. Each student was allowed to catch three fish and these fish were taken over to the fish cleaning area, cleaned, put into bags with each individual name of the student and then put on ice in coolers for the kids to take home.

Lunch for everyone consisted of hamburger, cheeseburgers, turkey burgers, veggie burgers, hot dogs, chicken breast sandwiches, fresh fruit, chips, donuts, and dessert, juice, water and drinks.

Again, we would like to thank the Berke Family Trust for their continued support of this event.




