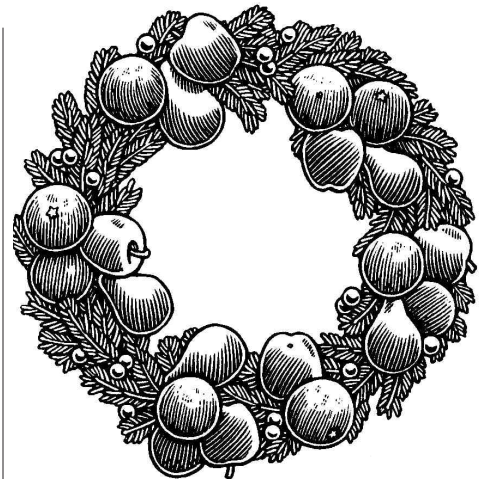
Good Sportsmanship is worth all the fish in the ocean! Sounds familiar? Most would recognize it as our club's motto. Sportsmanship—conduct becoming a sportsman. Is that you? Whether you joined the club, years ago, or just recently, you agreed to abide by its' by-laws and conduct yourself in a manner consistent with the club's philosophy. Volunteerism is a tenet of the club since its' founding more than 50 years ago. We have over 125 active members on our rolls, but when it comes to helping during an event, it seems like most have gone fishing. When you joined LARRC it should have been about helping others, not helping yourself to better, less crowded fishing trips. Al Scow's report on a recent 10 day Excel Trip

Our October 10-day *Excel* trip visited Alijos Rocks for some quality yellowfin as well as some homeguard yellowtail. A 176-lb. yellowfin and a 57.5-lb. yellowtail were top fish. The trip resulted in a total of 185 yellowfin, 175 yellowtail, 56 dorado and 39 wahoo.

Fishing began on the third day with all the Dorado you wanted and some wahoo.

The best stop was for seven wahoo and a good number of dorado off a kelp patty located on "The Ridge" east of Alijos Rocks. The next day saw decent fishing on Thetis bank with some school size yellowfin up to 30 lbs along with 10 wahoo. Passenger **Mike Bruner** caught a nice 60-lb. gulf grouper on a jig. With some quantity already on the boat and reports of boats leaving the rocks, **Capt. Shawn Steward** decided to make a move to the rocks for some quality yellowfin.

"Things were slow for the five boats down there when we left so I decided to hit the ridge before running to the rocks. I was hoping for some of the pressure to be taken off the fish and our timing seemed to work out for us," said Capt. Steward.

After arriving at the rocks mid-morning we anchored up northwest of the rocks for excellent yellowtail fishing with the yellows in the 24- to 45-lb. range but with word of yellowfin biting on the east side it was crucial to leave the biting yellowtail to get some nice tuna. We picked away at the yellowfin in the 60- to 80-lb. range and ended up with 20 nice ones. Late in the afternoon we were hit by some bruisers that spooled or broke off five unlucky anglers. They were just too big and couldn't be stopped. However, everyone now knew the potential that was out there and looked forward to landing a big one next day.

The fifth day of fishing and second at the rocks saw exceptional fishing, even by Alijos standards. There were 63 yellowfin

over 40 lbs and most were between 60 and a 100. The morning started off slowly but as the day warmed up the fishing followed, "boil, boil, ah there's another boil" soon rang through the air from the bait tank. The kite baits were the first to get going and the rotation picked up, one after another fish took the live squid bait on the kite. Angler Ken James landed a 176 lb beauty with the aid of a shark which bit the fish's tail.

The final day at the rocks saw excellent weather—however the fishing was a little slower, by departure time at 1600 there had been 26 yellowfin (60- to 100-lb. range) put on the boat along with some wahoo, dorado and yellowtail.

"Usually the yellows get real skinny and sucked-up looking after the fifty-pound mark but this one was short and fat, almost like an amberjack." Said **Mike Ramirez**, the *Excel's* engineer of a beautiful

57.5-lb. yellowtail.

Dennis Braid topped the day off when he caught a 125-lb. yellowfin after an hour long stand-off using 50-lb. line. Shortly after the battle the anchor was lifted and the vessel trolled around the rocks taking a last look at their unusual formation.

On the way home Captain Steward aimed at an area inside called Turtle Bay, just north of San Pablo Canyon, where we enjoyed some excellent yellowtail fishing on the drift. The trip ended with a number of drifts over some high spots for some big red snapper and lingcod for lunch. "The Cherry on the Top" for an excellent trip. LARRC club members participating were: **Dan Felger, Sally Vickers, Gerald Steinberg, and Thornton Ibbetson.** ■

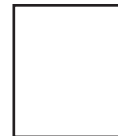
