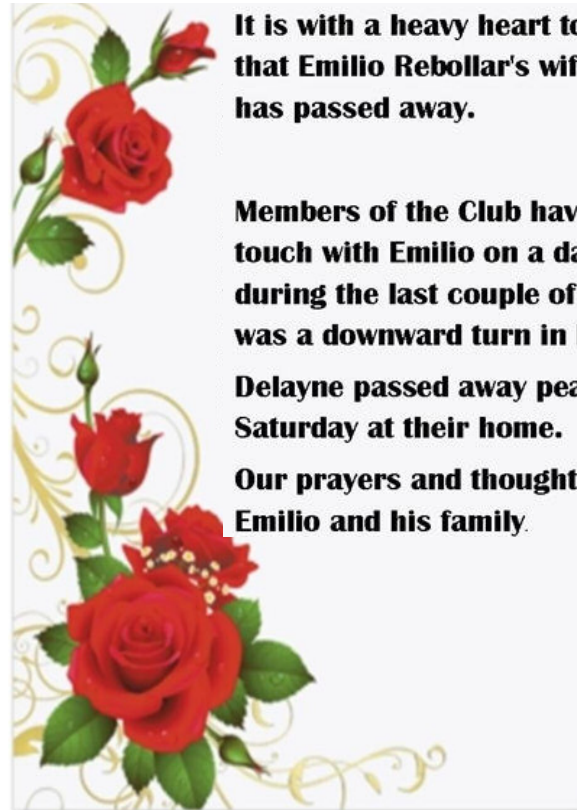
## **CCA CAL Year End Update**

CCA CAL has had a busy year protecting your freedom to fish. We now have 4 local chapters, Los Angeles, San Diego, Orange County, and a consolidated Oxnard / Ventura / Santa Barbara chapter. Through our fundraisers and membership drives we now have the means to undertake numerous activities in support of our objectives. In 2016 these included:

- CCA CAL is working to protect California angler's opportunity to continue to fish for Bluefin tuna in CA waters.
- CCA CAL is partnering with Hubbs SeaWorld Research Institute on the white seabass hatchery program through the CCA CAL White Seabass Committee.
- CCA CAL collected 12 halibut in SD to help move forward the process of adding halibut to the hatchery program.
- CCA CAL is working to create more habitat and fish through artificial reefs.
- CCA CAL is supporting the effort to remove drift gill nets and to insure that they are not replaced with long lines.
- CCA CAL has now become the primary advocate for the saltwater anglers in Southern CA.

Our success depends on a strong network of local chapters. As we begin our march north to central and northern California it is critical we do not lose the momentum we have gained here in Southern California. The Los Angeles Rod and Reel Club has been instrumental in supporting CCA CAL and foundational in the creation of the Los Angeles Chapter. 2017 will be our breakthrough year thanks to your continued support.

# Four Days In Mag Bay

A short 90-minute flight and 2 hour van ride brought club members John Ballotti, Donald Goldsobel, David Levinson and Joel Steinman from the hustle and bustle of Los Angeles to the serene village of Adolfo Lopez Mateo on the north end of Mag Bay. The no hassle, half empty flight on Alaska Airlines, efficient and friendly customs and immigration procedure in

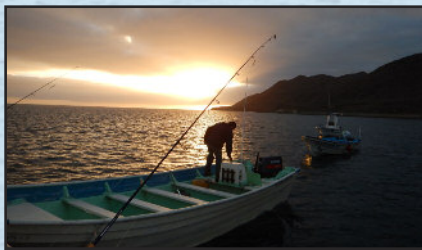
Bob Hoyt of Mag Bay Outfitters arranged a custom four-day panga expedition inside the bay featuring light line and fly-fishing. The twist on this adventure was the use of his sport fisher El Wahoo Loco as a mother ship towing pangas. This allowed the group to fish the entire bay from the north of Lopez Mateo all the way down to the main Entrada south of San Carlos.

The El Wahoo Loco is a comfortable vessel that has 6 bunks with a full galley and a head with a shower. It is perfect for four anglers allowing significant room for storage. Mag Bay Outfitters also has a clean comfortable house for shore-based trips that sleeps 5 with two bathrooms.

The first day saw the group fish north of Lopez Mateo with John fly-fishing and the others using lures and shrimp. Day one was slow for the conventional anglers and good for the fly fisherman who was able to hook and release 11 fish of 6 different species including 2

Days two, three and four were south of Lopez Mateo and the catching really turned on for everyone. Highlights of the trip included outstanding Jack Crevalle fishing at an oyster farm near San Carlos and consistent catching nearly every where else. Donald brought the trip to a close with an outstanding catch of a 4 and a half-pound Snook. The four day total was 13 different species overall with 8 coming on the fly. The species caught were:

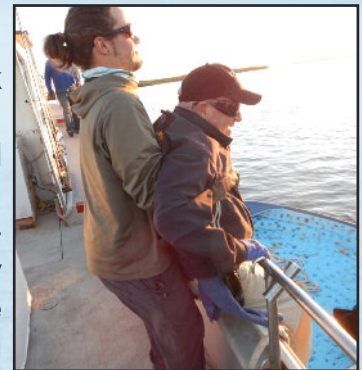
The Mexican Government has closed Mag Bay to commercial fishing. The result is no gill nets, no long lines, and no commercial fisherman racing through the bay. What is there is miles and miles of pristine wilderness, mangrove channels, wild life and a sense of what the bay must have looked like 500 years ago. This trip is a must for anyone who likes light line inshore fishing.

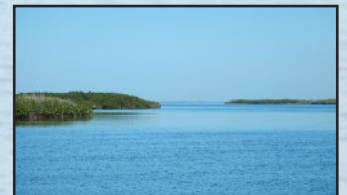

# ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

◆ What better time to talk about the maintenance of our fishing environment? End of the year - change of administrations - a very late season offshore where pelagics are still being caught in November. Bluefin bites were reported on 1.5 day trips to the Tanner Banks. Boats like the Aztec, New LoAnn and Tribute reported good catches but also lots of tackle busters.

We're all supposed to know about the Magnuson-Stevens Act, the one that our Dept. of Commerce uses to regulate fisheries. A lot of us agree that this spotlight has been shining too much on commercial issues but a favorable wind may be blowing in the direction of the sportfishing industry. An editorial in Salt Water Sportman (Jan '17) called my attention to this. A document by the CCC (Center for Coastal Conservation) had been submitted to NOAA. Also known as the Morris-Deal report of 2014 it has now caused NOAA to issue a National Saltwater Recreational Implementation Plan because the validity of the document was recognized.

This document, prepared by a consortium of nine contributors which included the ASA (American Sportfishing Assn), CCA (Coastal Conservation Assn), RFA (Recreational Fishing Alliance), IGFA (International Game Fishing Assn) etc. What was pointed out to the governmental agency was that there are 11 million saltwater anglers, who contribute \$70 billion annually to the economy. This creates about 455 thousand jobs.

Better ways to work with the states, treating the fishery as a natural resource rather than a commodity, loss of habitat, catch record keeping etc. are all on the agenda. ◆ Pacific Coast Sportfishing reports that a petition has been received by NMFS asking that BlueFin Tuna be listed as endangered. You all know that limits for recreational fishermen have recently been reduced to two (from 10) per day! Listing as "endangered" means they are off limits, period. The NMFS has 90

days to verify if the petition has merit. Noted also - the recreational catch has been higher than the commercial during a number of years since 2010...

◆ You're going to love this one! A Nov. 14th TIME item reports on the shrinking wildlife globally. The conservation group World Wildlife Fund has a new report that populations of birds, mammals and fish dropped 58% from 1970 to 2012. They forecast that by 2020 two-thirds of wildlife populations will be lost.

### ◆ ALASKA ON YOUR MIND?

Since 2007 Chinook (King) runs have been below average. 2016 runs were better but still below long term averages according to [ADFG.Alaska.Gov.com](http://ADFG.Alaska.Gov.com) Exact reasons are hard to pin down but precipitation, temperatures and currents affect juvenile survival. In 2015 NOAA paid recreational and commercial interests \$13M for loss relief. These funds came through disaster relief funds from Magnuson-Stevens coffers. Other funds went for salmon research and affected buyers. Refer to ADFG Home Page - "Chinook Initiative."

# Election Day Vets Fishing Trip - A Vote for Fun in the Sun

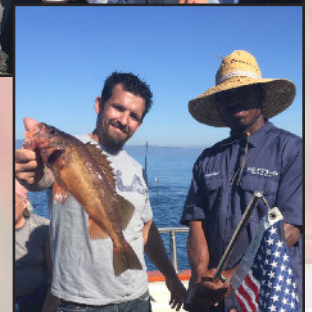

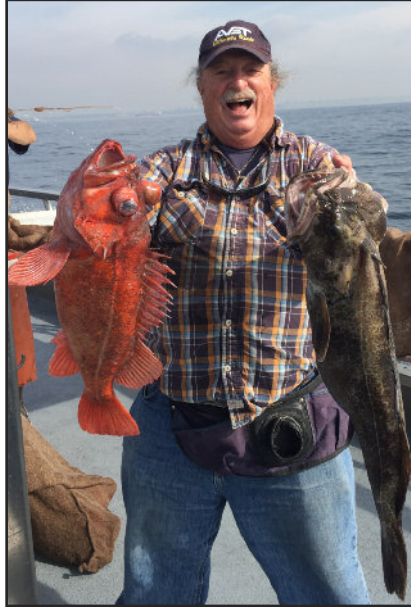
Just when I thought local fishing could not get any better for 2016 in Santa Monica Bay, it did.
