## A Trip of a Thousand Casts

Departure day for the 2004 Los Angeles Rod & Reel Club's 7-day calico bass skiff trip finally arrived. Last minute cancellations turned a limited load of 18 into a light load of 16. Club members **John Ballotti, Dennis Saylor, Arnold Scherpenborg, Karl Forster, Eric Rogger, John Seymour, Dan Felger, Al Scow, Tom Carlisle, Rick Uribe, Vince Shriver, and Ben Susman** were joined by club guests—and prospective members—**John Eads, and Alex Rentziperis.**

Rounding out the charter was host **Barry Brightenburg** of Fish Trap Lures and *Western Outdoor News* saltwater editor and columnist **Rich Holland.**

The *Qualifier 105*, berthed at Point Loma Sportfishing was a beehive of activity as the crew prepared her for the upcoming trip. Lined up in anticipation of the come aboard signal, everyone was mentally preparing for the start of the long awaited trip. At 9:15 a.m. it came. Everyone had a priority. Some went for the prime tackle box locations while others staked out their favorite rod positions. After the initial rush, a calm set in as everyone began rigging their tackle and seeking crew advice on set ups, especially from skiff drivers Cal, Joe and Tommy.

The boat departed on schedule and, after about an hour and half at the bait receivers, cleared Point Loma around 2 p.m. At the traditional start of the trip briefing, Captain **Brian Sims** indicated that the northern areas of San Martin and Isla San Jeronimo were plagued with cold, off-color water and had yielded unsatisfactory fishing on their last trip. His plans were

to by-pass this area and head straight for Benitos. The anticipated arrival time at Benitos would be 2:00 pm on Sunday. At the conclusion of the Captain's briefing, Barry Brightenburg handed out goodie bags to everyone. The bags contained P-

Line, several plastics in different sizes and colors, along with Fish Trap and Shimano hats. A Shimano Torium 20 reel and Teramar rod were donated by Shimano as the raffle grand prize. After dinner that evening, Tom Carlisle was the lucky winner.

Benitos appeared on the horizon right on schedule and the boat motored around checking conditions before launching the first skiff run of the trip. The water temperature was 62 degrees and a slight green color. Two skiff runs were completed on Sunday with numerous 4- and 5-pound fish, caught and released. The next day dawned overcast and cool. On Monday, bass fishing was excellent or average depending on time of day and location. Some runs had the best fishing of the trip, while others scratched away to

get a few fish. The big boat ran off the island about three miles looking for bird activity signaling the presence of yellow-tail. When found, the boat would slide into the feeding fish. The action was very good. Two or three yellowtail would be landed and then the boat took off for the next spot of fish. On the bass front, Barry, Rich and Arnold had the skiff-run of a lifetime. They found consistent 4- and 6-pound fish concentrated in one area on the weather side of the island. It was amazing calico bass fishing.

Tuesday morning found the boat anchored at Chester Rock with the wind blowing 20-plus knots and an opposing ripping current. Everything was wrong. It would be dangerous to launch the skiffs.

Brian decided to pull the anchor and head for the south end of Cedros Island. Fishable conditions were found and the skiffs were launched. The water temperature was 64.5 degrees. It was during the first run at Cedros that Vince Shriver land-

ed an 8-lb., 8-oz. calico that would eventually stand-up as the calico jackpot winner. Vince was using a 5" brown lead head with red flake Fish Trap plastic tied to 20-lb. P-line. Later in the day, Brian put the big boat on a kelp line drift that yielded numerous 3- to 5-lb. calicos. There was a great calico sunset bite from the big boat with most casts resulting in a quality fish.

Wednesday was sunny and cool and found the charter still at the south end of Cedros. While the first skiff run was out, Brian chased yellowtail and during one stop half of those aboard were hooked up. The second skiff run was excellent. Many calicos in the 2- to 4-lb. range were caught. Tom brought his fly rod on the skiff run and connected with quite a few calicos. On the last skiff run of the day, Rick connected with a legal halibut. While Vince was reeling in a 1-lb. calico, a rather large halibut latched on to the fish and then let go before being stuck by the hook. What was left was a chewed up calico. On the big boat it was excellent yellowtail fishing with 'tails landed in excess of 40 lbs. As the skiffs were being loaded for the night, Karl hooked a home guard on a surface iron. The toad was brought to the boat in expert fashion. At the dock it weighed 46 pounds. It was the game fish jackpot winner.

After dinner, Brian motored out toward

Benitos to check out the conditions. The wind was howling and the ocean lumpy. Unsafe condition to launch the skiffs.

Thursday found the boat at Cedros again. White sea bass showed up on the counts today. Tom caught a 10-pounder and numerous shorts were caught and released. The last skiff runs were excellent with calicos up to 6-lbs. taken. Yellowtail fishing from the big boat was steady with sizeable fish over 20 lbs. landed. As the boat motored up the lee of Cedros, Brian's plan was to move north to San Martin

Island, arriving at around 9 a.m. and fish until around 2 p.m.

The overnight wind and opposing current were so strong that the Friday arrival time at San Martin was actually 2 p.m.—no time to launch skiffs. Brian put the *Qualifier* into another kelp line drift. A few calicos were taken. Using a dropper loop and a sardine, Dan caught a keeper halibut. The last sizeable fish of the trip was caught! Equipment was broken down, rinsed with fresh water and stowed for the ride home. Arriving at Point Loma at 6 am Saturday, the yellowtail were offloaded, sorted and packed. A trip that was so long in coming was over too fast.

# Sitka Alaska, Another June Trip for the Books

**O**n Thursday, June 3, the LARRC group was picked up at the airport and driven to Kingfisher Lodge just in time for a prime rib dinner. We all had great expectations of

catching a big salmon or giant halibut and one of the reasons for arriving early was to catch some good eating lings before the season closed. Lingcod have to be between 30 and 40 inches to be a legal keeper. The first day our group-of-four caught their limit of salmon but the halibut were harder to come by. We made up our catch limits with lingcod and a number of yellow eyed rockfish. **John Rhind** and **Rob Weinstock** had a slow first-day of fishing. At the end of the second day **Dave** and **Fred** returned with limits of lingcod and yellow eye with some salmon and halibut thrown in. Observing a big smile on Rob's face, Fred asked him, "why are you smoking a cigar?" and Rob answered: "I caught a 171-pound halibut". This was shared with John Rhind as Rob was feeling no pain. **Sally Vickers** and **Jerry Steinberg** did their thing trying to catch salmon by mooching, but they had to switch to trolling when that was not successful. The couple stayed an extra day and filled their freezers. The variety of fish and that extra day

allowed them to catch and release after getting their limits. **Sam and Ann Rubinfeld** paired with **Phil Bell and Bob Jones**. They felt that their skipper was new to the area and experienced slower fishing. The highlight of

the trip was our being treated with special care. **Brian**, our skipper, ran the Gentleman out of Cisco's Landing and remembered all the people from the Pacific Clipper days. He made certain that we were using the correct


techniques. Urging patience on our part we wound up with just as much halibut because they weighed between 40 and 80 lbs. I caught a 60- and 44-lb. halibut on the last day for a pleasant finish. All the negative reports concerning the weather turned out to be incorrect. When our members can trade fish stories, share experiences, beautiful scenery—what else can you ask for? Good food and excellent bag lunches were standard.
