ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS

FRESHWATER

This column usually focuses on Salt Water activities but some of the LARRC fishermen also love their freshwater sports. In case you had not seen this report, it was published in the LATimes early this month, it concerns mercury polluted fish which has been found in a wide range of California's reservoirs and lakes.

The State Water Resources Boards suggested that warnings be posted about consumption of bass which in particular pose risks for pregnant women and children. It has been suggested that rainbow trout and crappie populations be increased. Although bass are usually released serious warnings may be a couple of years away although contamination levels have been on the increase.

Affected areas have been at Lake Sherwood, Bass Lake, Crowley Lake, Lake Arrowhead etc. Coal fired power plants are the main source of mercury in the air and it travels great distances contaminating oceans, lakes and rives.

Saltwater fishermen don't feel left out! Mercury levels in Pacific Ocean caught swordfish and yellowfin tuna have been increasing at a 3.8% rate since 1998. Studies at the Universities of Hawaii and Michigan have traced this to coal burning plants in Asia.

PFMC CHANGES COURSE

Last month's dinner meeting featured Theresa LaBriola, West Coast Fisheries Director for Wild Oceans. Theresa has just submitted an update regarding one of a number of "improvements" taking place re: our fisheries. Despite overwhelming support on the part of the fishing public, the Pacific Fishery Management Council has now reversed approval of the DSBG. Deep set buoy gear has been studied a long time as an improved method to reduce bycatch such as found in the traditional nets used by the commercial fishing industry. Phasing in this new type of gear would have eliminated much of the bycatch and wasteful killing of non-targeted species. It was assumed that this decision would be enforced. The CDFW (California Department of Fish and Wildlife) had been supportive at the March meeting.

California made the motion to delay implementation suggesting more information was needed. Wild Oceans has joined CCA of California and the IGFA in joint letter to the Director of California Fish and Wildlife requesting a meeting to discuss this change of heart. Stay tuned!

Epic Bluefin Bite on the Rooster 5 Days in U.S. Waters

This was an amazing fishing trip to remember in so many ways. On Sunday, Aug. 21st, 31 anglers left the dock from San Diego on the Red Rooster 3 for a 5-day fishing adventure. LARRC members included Charter Master Larry Brown, Club President Donald Goldsobel, Mike Hartt, and Phil Bell.

Larry had a load of giveaways from his 27 plus sponsors. The first raffle was a free giveaway, where we could choose any item on the galley tables, and everybody re-

ceive 5 nice raffle items. The second raffle was \$10 per ticket and raised money for veteran and kid's fishing trips. I got very, very, lucky and won a Phenix rod, and Costa sunglasses. Larry raised \$2,160 for veterans and kids fishing trips. Part of the proceeds will be donated to LARRC.

After a disappointing first day, we fished for 2 days near the Colnett Islands and caught near limits of Yellowtail. Mike, Larry, Donald and Phil

all caught some nice yellows. Donald caught a really nice 30 plus lb. yellow near the end of our yellowtail stay. A total of 300 yellowtail were brought to gaff.

On the final day of fishing, we headed North into U.S. waters, and arrived at the 43 Spot between San Clemente and San Diego at 5 AM. About 50 boats were in the general area when we got there.

Captain Derek looked around until he found a nice school of Bluefin. I caught a 74 lb. and 148 lb. bluefin using a Shimano Flatfall jig. Most of the other anglers caught fish on



a Chark Bait Slasher jig green or red. A few were caught on bait.

In the afternoon we saw thousands of big bluefin boiling, crashing and splashing. We stopped on that spot and several anglers were rewarded with big Bluefin over 100 ibs. The jackpot weighed 153 lbs. and was caught during this bite.

Kudos goes to Larry Brown, Captain Derek Waldman, and crewmembers Fernando, Nick, Tom, and Nate for a great trip. Of course the food was outstanding beginning with Beef Wellington, ending with Prime Rib, with the best prepared Wahoo ever in between. Chefs Mike and RJ were responsible for these delectable meals.

PACIFIC DAWN AUGUST 8-9, 2016 LARRC CHARTER Article by Chas Schoemaker and to a lesser extent, Mark Manculich

The LARRC anglers on the San Diego dock faced a decision. They had traveled to San Diego for a two day trip on the Pacific Dawn, equipped and anticipating a trip for yellowtail and school sized yellowfin tuna. The Dawn had just returned from an overnight trip. The count was four fish, all massive bluefin tuna. Two over 150 lbs, the other two hanging from the scales, each weighing over 200 pounds.

The dilemma: if we went for big fish, only one or two people could fish at a time and there might only be a limited number of fish for the boat. But they would be big ones.

Chartermaster Mark Manculich consulted with Captain Cavanaugh, conducted a seminar, had a look-see at the hanging tuna and opened the matter for discussion to the entire group. The vote was to go for glory.

The first day was spent flying a kite, trolling yummy flyers, with a two person rotation. For many, this was their first experience with flying a kite and found it extremely exciting. Heavy duty stand up gear was on board, so if the fish bit, the proper tackle was at the ready. Unfortunately, conditions had changed, and the big tuna were not cooperating. A greyhounding marlin got the adrenalin pumping at one point leaping over and over in the near distance.

To make matters even more frustrating, several small schools of quite respectable 40 to 50 pound size bluefin tuna were located. At one point the boat stopped on at school, soon thereafter to be surrounded by breaking bluefin tuna, none of which wanted to take a bait, flatfall, or anything else in the water.

The changed conditions made a move necessary. A long overnight 90 mile run put us in an area loaded with kelp paddies. As always, the trick was to find one with someone home and willing to play. The first several stops found scattered cooperating fish, resulting in a few yellowtail flopping on the deck.

A good kelp paddy was located with many cooperative fish, allowing everyone to join the party and tug on a fish. The final tally was 43 yellowtail, ranging from 12 to about 30 pounds. Throw in a couple Dorado and it was a nice day.

We had traveled so far we had an eight hour plus run to get back to the dock. This allowed for plenty of



time to break down the gear, clean the equipment, and have conversations to reconnect with friends who had not been seen since last year's trip. We also had time for Cook Richie to prepare a delicious fresh yellowtail dinner.

Jackpot winners were Mike Godfrey and Chas Schoemaker. Uncle Sol and nephew (and past president) Joel Zide and father and son Mark and Montana Manculch spent a busy morning pulling on the yellowtail.






Knot tying with Charter Master Ted Feit






Cathy Needleman with the largest bluefin tuna to date caught out of 22nd St. Landing


