## NO DINNER MEETING THIS MONTH 2022 CHARTER PROPOSALS

Hello LARRC Club Members,

I hope you and your families are well and enjoying the holiday season. If you are like me, you are really excited about your fishing prospects in 2022. However, you have nothing planned.

In 2021, we canceled all our charters in response to the pandemic and put two last minute trips on the calendar once it was understood that the boats were operational. The trips turned out to be a success as we filled both boats and got out on the water. One trip was highlighted by a 30 minute fight on 15 lb. test resulting in an estimated 30 lb. homeguard yellowtail at Catalina. Congratulations to the lucky angler!

Given our success with the two last minute charters in 2021, LARRC is motivated to sponsor charter trips in 2022 and get the club fishing together. The challenge we face is how to satisfy the varying fishing preferences of the club membership. This challenge has created an opportunity for all our club members to design their own charter and propose it to the board.

Below are the parameters for your proposal:

1. Consider a trip or destination fishing trip that you want the club to sponsor. This is a trip you commit to participating in. Some examples are chartering a sportfishing boat during tuna season, a road trip to the Old Mill in San Quintin, a rental boat trip to Lake Cachuma, an Eastern Sierra trip, a six pack targeting white seabass, securing X number of spots on a Long Range trip. It's your trip and you get to design it.
2. Research available date(s) of the trip and cost of the charter/cost per angler. Pencil the club in with the owner or landing.
3. Confirm deposit amount.
4. Email me your proposal for submission to the LARRC Board for approval consideration at [aratzky@att.net](mailto:aratzky@att.net).

If your proposal is approved, be prepared to be the "Charter Master" on behalf of the club. So be sure your schedule is free. I will of course support you as needed, but you will be the face of the club for the trip.

I look forward to your proposals, and yes you can submit more than one. Feel free to reach out to me with questions.

Your Board of Directors has approved a proposed Charter on the Navagante out of Redondo Beach Sportfishing. We have Cathy Needleman to thank for originating this charter. The joint charter Masters will be by Cathy and, Donald Goldsobel. This is a limited load trip. We will take 18 anglers. The Navagante will leave Redondo at 9:00 p.m. on the evening of Tuesday, August 16, fish local or offshore on the 17 and 18 returning to the dock on the early evening of the 18th. The cost per person is \$502. The fare includes all meals, crew tip and fish cleaning. To reserve your place, we need your Liability Waiver, proof of vaccination and check for the full amount. After 60 days from this posting, the trip will be opened to non-club members. Members of your family are considered members.

Do not miss this prime time opportunity to target Tuna, Yellowtail, White Sea Bass and all of the many game fish found in these waters. Redondo is ideally situated so as to enable the Navagante and its sister boat, the Pescador, to go to where the fish are.

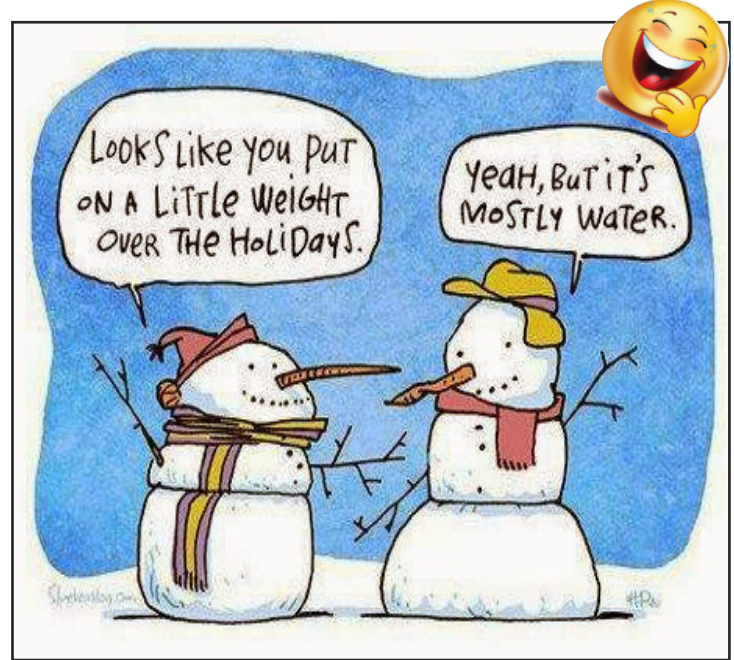
## ONE SMALL STEP

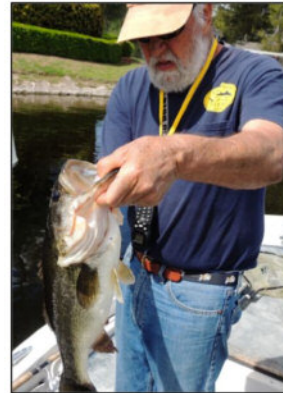
## Let us introduce ourselves!

# ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

Earlier this year, I was asked to contribute to The Chum Line to help keep members aware of environmental matters that impact our oceans and our sport of fishing. I hope my articles have informed or intrigued you or made you ask some questions about what's important to you, to the health of our oceans and our fisheries, and to the future of saltwater angling.

Working for Wild Oceans, I spend a lot of time on the science and management side of the equation, attending meetings and advocating for forward looking strategies that keep enough fish in the ocean for future generations. I missed our last Club meeting because it overlapped with an International meeting where Pacific fishing nations agreed to increase commercial bluefin catch, but just a little to keep its course towards recovery, and to maintain, but not increase longline tuna activity, which keeps the bycatch of sharks, marine mammals and marlins to status quo for now.

If there are local issues or national issues you'd like me to track, let me know. And I'll do my best to give you all some updates and thoughtful perspective. Please reach out if you want to talk about my work or my writing or if have questions or comments or you want to get more involved in preserving our oceans our fish and fishing.

◆ A few months ago, I reported about the dire situation of the Atlantic shortfin mako shark. **To rescue the endangered shortfin mako, fishing nations in the North Atlantic have agreed to ban catches of the world's fastest shark.** Countries agreed to "end overfishing immediately and to gradually achieve biomass levels sufficient to support maximum sustainable yield by 2070" for mako shark. <https://www.theguardian.com/environment/2021/nov/24/atlantic-fishing-nations-agree-to-ban-catches-of-mako-worlds-fastest-sharks>

◆ My work often leads me to advocate for better commercial fishing gear that catches more of the target species and less bycatch, including salmon, marlin, seabirds, and sea turtles. This leads to a healthier ocean ecosystem and better small boat and recreational fishing opportunities. **Now, a bipartisan group of Alaska lawmakers are demanding action on excessive fisheries bycatch.** The bycatch issue came to a head this summer when all Yukon River salmon fisheries were canceled due to so few returning chinook and chums. Along with ocean and climate impacts, villagers questioned the takes by huge trawlers that catch and process fish at sea. Most Alaskan bycatch is taken by a wrong gear or the fish is caught out of season or it's too small. Bycatch totals in 2020 were 3.3 million pounds by pot gear, over 38.5 million pounds by hook and line gear and over 92 million pounds by trawlers <https://www.adn.com/business-economy/2021/11/22/alaska-lawmakers-in-both-parties-demand-action-on-excessive-fisheries-bycatch/>

◆ At the national level, **the Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife of the House Natural Resources Committee held its legislative hearing for Representative Huffman's Magnuson-Stevens reauthorization bill.** There was a lot of discussion on many topics, but the main themes throughout included, climate change, bycatch, forage fish and the need for better science and data collection. ◆ The other big news from the Capitol was that the **House finally was able to pass the Build Back Better Act** sending it over to the Senate. The package included a few notable sections:

- Section 70201 - Investing in Coastal Communities and Climate Resilience - provides \$6,000,000,000 to NOAA for, "projects that conserve, restore, and protect coastal and marine habitats to increase climate resilience of coastal communities or sustain coastal and marine resource-dependent communities.
- Section 70202 - Pacific Salmon Restoration and Conservation - provides \$1,000,000,000 to NOAA for, "supporting habitat restoration and conservation projects for Pacific salmon and steelhead populations and their habitats, including projects that increase climate resilience and adaptation.
- Section 70204 - Marine Fisheries and Marine Mammal Stock Assessments, Surveys, and Research and Management - provides \$500,000,000 to NOAA for, "carrying out stock assessments, science, surveys, ecosystem-based assessments, marine fisheries data collection, scientific research, acquisition of electronic monitoring equipment, and transitional gear research

◆ Finally, **NOAA is Taking Comments for Proposed Chumash Heritage National Marine Sanctuary.** The proposed area is approximately 7,600 acres and includes 156 miles of coastline. It extends offshore to include Santa Lucia Bank, Rodriguez Seamount, and Arguello Canyon. There are several virtual public meetings scheduled and comments are due January 10. <https://conservefish.org/2021/11/18/noaa-taking-comments-for-proposed-chumash-heritage-national-marine-sanctuary/>

# SOOMM

New acronym! **SOOMM**-SCARED OUT OF MY MIND. I left for Louisiana in hopes of going bow fishing at night and ocean fishing during the day. I was there last year and weather prevented me from doing the “bowfish” adventure, so I decided to go back and try again.

I did find an archery teacher at Rancho Park, who was patient, knowledgeable and helped me a great deal. I did about three months of archery lessons. I felt I knew enough.

I was apprehensive of going alone (**SOOMM**) – so much has changed during COVID and Hurricane IDA. Places I was going to stay were gone and there were huge political differences about social distancing, wearing masks and vaccinations.

Flew into New Orleans to go on a shuttle (waited for one that was not crammed with people) to get to my rented car. It was 8:30 at night and I knew I had to get breakfast and lunch for the next day of ocean fishing. Took an off-ramp towards a sign I saw on the freeway. I was **SOOMM**, because I stuck out like a sore thumb. I quickly got some food and ran out.

On the way to the B&B Lodge I recognized a restaurant (Thompson’s) that I experienced the last time I was there. I stopped and immediately calmed down! I made friends with a four-year-old boy, Liam. We talked about fishing, he looked at my pictures on my phone and we became instant buddies! I cherished the big hugs I got from him and had dinner with him every night (his mom was one of the waitresses there).

Got to the B&B around 9:30. Proceeded to climb three flights of stairs in the dark (**SOOMM**) with luggage. Pressed code to get in.

Locked my door, hardly slept and got ready to drive to Cypress Cove Marina (Venice) to fish the ocean. I told Captain Martha Spencer to fish for what was biting.

Target species for the day swordfish! Deep drop (drifting with squid below a 1000 feet) was the method and I was sur-

prised at the amount of bites we got. They have a much larger fishery but the fish are smaller than the swords we get here.

Rod did a big bend and I knew that was probably a shark. After two hours of straight winding a huge thresher shark came up. He was the length of the boat was surprised at how large the eyes were. What a beautiful fish.

Let him go and soon we were rewarded with a bite. Rod was bit on the way up and two hours later a devil swordfish (they do figure eights, they change direction, they jump and do anything to get slack on the line. It’s just what they do) was gaffed and brought on board. Fish was so long they had to cut the sword off to put in the fish box. It weighed 209 LBS

Went back to the dock and was too tired to go bow fishing. It was my original reason for even going to Venice, Louisiana but all I wanted to do was eat and wash up and sleep.

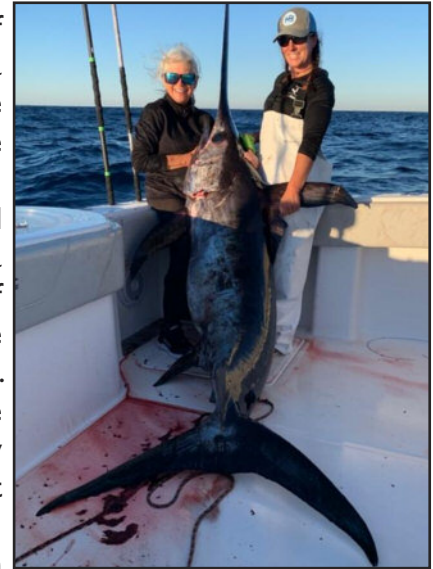
Got a call from the bow fishing guy Allen – where was I and how come I’m not at his place yet to bow fish. I explained that I was fishing during the day and would see him tomorrow night.

While I was having dinner with my little buddy Liam I got another call from Allen. Where was I having dinner and could he come by and talk to me. I ordered him some oysters and he proceeded to tell me that I should stay at his place-it was new and clean and that I would be taken care of. **SOOMM!!!!!!**

I saw that people in the restaurant knew him and decided to move my stuff over to his operation.

Woke up-met Captain Martha for lunch and then back to Buras to go bow fishing.

Allen and I drove about 20 minutes with airboat in tow. Boat in the water and then the lights were turned on and **I WAS IN A WORLD THAT I NEVER EXPERIENCED BEFORE. BIRDS AND DUCKS FLYING,**

We were moving fast and then I started to calm down. I was safe and I was having an adventure. It was enough just being on the boat.

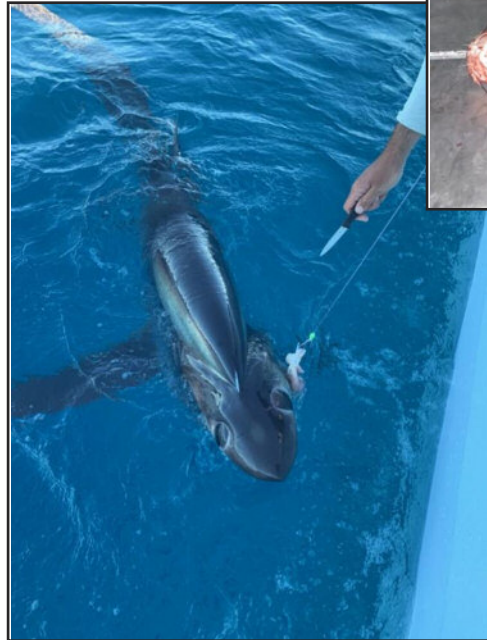
I shot a few arrows but they all bounced off the fish. I was ok with that-I needed a smaller bow and arrow set and I knew I was going the next night and I would have another chance. Got back around 1:00am and up again at 5:00am to ocean fish with Captain Martha.

This was pure fun, racing around in a little catamaran catching black fin tuna, trolling for wahoo (no biters) and also bottom grabbers. Had a great time with them!

Back again to Buras.

Final night of bow fishing and using a little girls bow n arrow set I caught a red drum, alligator gar, catfish and black drum! At around 3:00 am I looked at Allen and said, "Isn't it time to go home?"

Woke up the next day, flew home and slept for two days. Had my bow fishing experience but I would definitely go back and fish with Captain Martha.

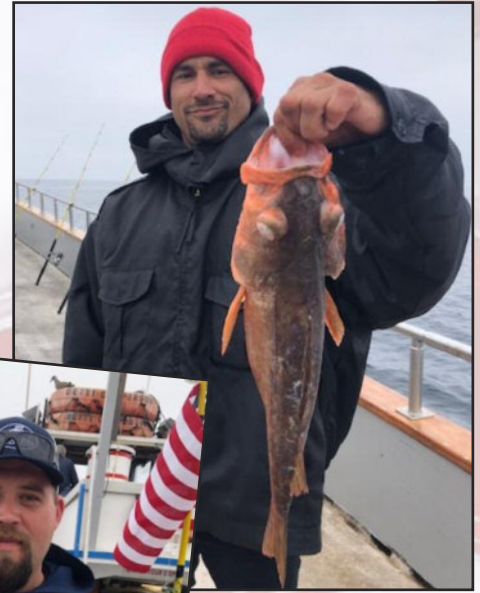

## Winter Bluefin Tuna?????

Where do all of the bluefin tuna go after leaving the Southern California Banks, Tanner, Cortez, San Clemente, etc? A small percentage get horny, begin their emergence into sexual maturity and head back to their birth place in the Sea of Japan and the South China Sea to spawn for the first time. Size doesn't drive this migration, because we see plenty of 200 and 300 pounders remain here in the Eastern Pacific, and remain sexually immature. The NOAA scientists work with our long range fishing processors to get BFT carcasses and test their gonads and there has NEVER been a BFT caught here, regardless of size, that has

achieved sexual maturity. It appears some may reach sexual maturity at 150 lbs and some may reach sexual maturity at 300 lbs, and that drives their migration "home" to the spawning grounds off Japan and China. It's crazy but true to think we are catching 200 and 300 lb adolescents in our local waters.

So a small percentage migrate back across the Pacific to spawn and the rest stay here in the Eastern Pacific. When this biomass leaves US California waters they take a very short migration south into Mexican waters for the winter and hunker off of the northern Baja coast. The long range boats see them returning from their 15 day trips, but never stop as they are traveling home, all the gear is broken down and it is in the middle of the last night before they return home.

California is depending on us. More on this just below.

Did CARB Vote to Remove Commercial Sportfishing Boats From the Ocean?

No, at least not yet. On November 19th, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) held a hearing at which time they heard that proposed engine emission regulations are structurally and economically infeasible for commercial passenger boats. They also heard from anglers who are concerned that as boat owners go out of business they will be denied access to offshore fishing and marine life.

Following public testimony, several board members expressed similar concerns, recognizing that boat owners are family operated businesses committed to protecting the environment, demonstrated by their actions to repower their boat to lower emission engines over the last several years. They just need a reasonable solution to cleaner air, not a radical approach involving vessel replacement.

The CARB board is expected to revisit the proposed regulations early next year, however, to what extent the draft regulations will be revised is unknown at this time. However, we can say with great certainty there is a role for anglers in the political process and they are uniquely positioned to influence the outcome of CARB's final decision. Between now and the hearing, anglers are encouraged to sign a petition that asks Governor Newsom to "Save Our Boats."
