# What's On My Mind

#### **Participation**

Our club's 75 years of continuous existence is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our volunteers. As the average age of our members rises, it's crucial for the next generation of club leaders to step forward. Are you ready to be one of them? I believe you are, but you might need more information about the available roles and the time commitment required to excel in these positions.

Let's discuss what is available. You should already know that the club has seven members on the board of directors who are responsible for the club's affairs overall. Directors serve a two-year term. The terms overlap, so some continue each year while others term out or stand for re-election. A director is limited to two consecutive terms.

Committees are the backbone of our club, driving all our activities. The committee chairs play a pivotal role in planning and executing these activities, ensuring the smooth functioning of the club.

Our club has 27 committees. That is a lot, and consolidation of similar committees may be in order. One important reason there are so many committees is to spread the work and not have any one committee chair overwhelmed. You do not need to be on the board of directors to be a committee chair. This is worth repeating. You do not need to be a member of the board of directors to be a committee chair. Some committees are more active, such as Chum Line or Membership. Some are not, e.g., Family Events and Taxes. Let's look at some of the more recognizable committees:

**Apparel**—The apparel chair is responsible for ordering the logo jackets, hats, sweatshirts, etc. We do not maintain an inventory except for hats. Steve Simon has been doing this for more years than I can remember. I know he would be happy to train a new Apparel Chair.

Charters – There is an overall club charter chair and individual charter masters for each charter. Dustin House is the club's charter chair. If you want to see more or a different type of charter, step up and research the boat or location. Determine the cost and present it to Dustin and the board of directors.

**Chum Line Editor**—The Chum Line is our newsletter, published monthly. The editor is responsible for assembling the articles and forwarding them to the graphic designer.



Sophia Huynh does a beautiful job, and I am sure she would like some help training the next editor.

**Environmental Affairs**—If you are interested in the environment and sustainable fishing, this would be an excellent committee chair for you. Non-resident member Theresa Labriola from Wild Oceans often contributes pertinent articles to the Chum Line. Local knowledge is also essential. Please get in touch with me if this interests you.

Membership—This is perhaps the most important committee. Richard Stone has done an outstanding job increasing membership over the last three years. I know Richard is looking for his replacement. If you like meeting new people and talking up the club and foundation activities, then this committee chair is just right for you.

**Earl Warren Memorial Kids' Trip** – This committee has two chairs: i) Volunteers and ii) Kids. It is the heart and soul of the club and foundation. Richard Stone and John Goss have worked tirelessly to invite, organize, and execute this special day. They would like to train the next generation of kids' trip leadership.

Lou Berke Trout / Catfish Derby - This special event for LAUSD special needs kids has become well known throughout the community. Taking nearly 100 special needs kids fishing each year, along with an equal number of volunteers, requires flawless preparation and execution. Steve Simon's dedication and enthusiasm for the event are infectious. Steve wants to work with the next-generation leader to ensure a smooth transition. It does take some time and energy to pull this event off. However, the children's giggles smiles, and squeals all makeup for it.

Mentors' and Veterans' Trips—The chair of these committees' primary function is arranging for the boat and participants. Working with kids and veterans is very rewarding. If this interests you, please let me know.

# Why I chose my field of study

Whether it be environmental pressure, societal influence, or a combination of factors, the way humans perceive and respond to the environment has changed drastically throughout the years; and likewise the way neighboring species interact with people has changed. My general research interests are in understanding the interactions that result in the co-occurrence of human and non-human animals. What interests me the most within this field is quantifying what sensory cues drive marine predator interactions with people in the water. Historically, mitigation efforts to reduce risk of harm to people in the water have led to ecologically damaging programs such as gillnets and drum-lining. My motivation for research on human to non-human animal interactions is that these mitigation practices can be replaced or used more sparingly with scientifically informed policies as opposed to those based in fear or social stigma.
